

## Converting Handheld Times

Electric or digital timers which measure on one-hundredth of a second must be used. However, unless it is a fully automatic system, times registered in one one-hundredth of a second shall be rounded up to the next tenth of a second. (Example: 10.42 will be recorded as 10.5 unless a FAT system is used.) **If FAT and manual times be integrated, the hand-held time shall first be rounded up to the slower one-tenth of a second. Then a conversion factor of .24 must be added (i.e.,  $MT + .24 = FAT$ ).** A record shall not be granted unless the time is recorded by FAT.
